Update of NOM 001 SEMARNAT 2021, which establishes permissible limits of pollutants in wastewater discharges in federal receiving bodies.

The National Consultative Committee for the Normalization of the Environment and Natural Resources (Comarnat) approved on August 27, the Official Mexican Standard NOM-001-SEMARNAT-2021, which establishes the permissible limits of pollutants in wastewater discharges into federal receiving bodies, and it is expected to be published in the Federal Official Gazette in the coming days.

Said Standard replaces the one issued in 1996, and its main modifications include:

- New parameters for true color, chemical oxygen demand and toxicity are introduced.
- The maximum temperature for discharges in rivers, streams, canals and drains is reduced to 35 degrees.
- Updating of the list of Mexican Standards used to carry out the sampling and analysis of the parameters referred to for the application of this Standard, eliminating those that have been canceled or modified.
- The maximum permissible limits of pollutants in wastewater discharges to receiving bodies of national property will be modified, making them stricter.

- The parameter "Total Organic Carbon" will be incorporated to measure the organic load of pollutants in waters with a concentration greater than 1000 mg/l of chlorides.
- The concept of Instantaneous Value is also introduced, which is the result obtained from the laboratory analysis of a sample of residual water collected as a result of the verification carried out by CONAGUA or PROFEPA.
- The parameter of fecal coliforms would be replaced by the determination of Escherichia coli.
- The way in which residual water discharges are classified will be modified, considering the nature of the receiving body: rivers, streams, canals and drains; reservoirs, lakes and lagoons; Mexican marine zones and estuaries; and soils (irrigation of green areas or infiltration and other risks).

It is important to note that once this new Standard has been published in the Federal Official Gazette, it will be mandatory for those responsible for discharging wastewater in any type of federal receiving body in Mexico.

The Standard would not be applicable to water discharges from drains destined exclusively for rainwater or for those that discharge directly to municipal drainage and sewerage systems.
